#### Spotlight on... MCR Pathways





Since April 2024 we have been successfully delivering the Young Talent Programme from MCR Pathways, which comprises Group Work for selected S1 and S2 pupils and weekly mentor meetings, in school, for selected S3-S6 pupils.

Building on the stunningly successful work that the Glasgow based charity MCR Pathways has been delivering for 18 years, here at Largs Academy we now have 10 pupils who have been meticulously matched with a mentor, with more in the pipeline. Those mentors are volunteers, from near and far, who are given extensive training, support and resources to work with their matched young person.

The benefits of mentoring are longstanding and soundly proven, especially when it comes to attainment, attendance and achievement. For mentored young people though, the most consistent feedback we get is that they hugely value having a space to regularly talk about whatever they like, with someone who is independent from school.

We have a full time Pathways Coordinator in school, whose role is to support both the mentors and the pupils, along with delivering the weekly Group Work programme for S1 and S2 pupils. And he works closely with our Year Head and Pastoral Support teams to select, engage with and support those who are involved.
