
#### Spotlight on... Options

Throughout term 3 we have a high profile focus on our options process with our pupils who are selecting subjects for the next school year. Between January and March, our pupils all receive an information assembly in school about the process, PSE lessons focused on Careers and attend our Careers Fayre where they can speak to local and national employers, colleges, Universities and subject teachers. Alongside this, we schedule our Parents' Meetings for this term and ensure that all pupil and parents/carers have an up-to-date tracking report to support them in the process.
