## Health and Wellbeing Round Up









#### Spotlight on... Welfare Rights Officer

North Ayrshire Council's Money Matters have a dedicated service to support the families of Largs Academy with financial support. Audrey Ritchie - our Welfare Rights Officer (WRO) - is on call to give free and confidential advice to all parents and carers in our school community. The key objective of the WRO is to mitigate the effects of poverty faced by children and young people living in North Ayrshire through ensuring the parents / carers and pupils receive their legal entitlement to state benefits.

In session 2023/24 alone, Audrey has helped parents and carers of Largs Academy to receive £108,972 in unclaimed benefits. Across North Ayrshire, the total for this year is £506,509. The service is dedicated to getting the very most for our families. Audrey will be able to help our parents and carers with any Qs or concerns they may have.
