Spotlight on... our Mobile Phone Policy



During November we have been evaluating our Mobile Phone Policy with pupils, parents and staff. A recent parent survey received over 250 responses with the following results:

- -90% of parents support our "Turn Off & Tune In" policy (an increase of 9% since the implementation survey in May).
- -33% of parents report improved concentration and reports from their children about less teacher time wasted in lessons.
- -25% reported improved wellbeing and improved peer to peer relationships outside of school.

This positive parent feedback mirrors feedback from staff:

- -100% of staff support our "Turn Off &Tune In" policy
- -95% of staff report less time wasted in lessons because of mobile phones whilst 75% of staff report better pupil engagement since the implementation.

Alongside this, almost half of our pupils reported positive benefits both inside and outside the classroom since implementation.

We are proud of the success of this new approach to mobile phones in our school and with the continued implementation of our existing policy moving forwards.
